We have to manage them wisely, with a focus on cost efficiency, environmental stewardship, and accountability to the people who fund government with their hard-earned dollars.

Approving this expansion isn't a step backward—it's a step toward stability. It's a demonstration that we can still lead with balance and reason, ensuring Oregonians get dependable, affordable public services today while we plan smarter for tomorrow.

I urge you to approve this permit, protect taxpayers, and reinforce the message that Oregon's local and state leaders are capable of making practical, forward-looking decisions that serve everyone—not just special interests or political agendas.
