Republic Services hired consultants submitted an odor study based on 2005 on-site weather conditions stating that they used the information because it was the only information available. Thank you for the opportunity to speak and I ask that you allow everyone who has signed up the opportunity to speak.






Figure 7: Annual average temperature changes in Salem, Oregon. Note the large year-to-year variations of 2-3°C and the small overall trend (blue line).
