My name is Kathleen Rochester of 1480 NW Meadowgreen Place, Corvallis OR 97330.

I am writing because I strongly oppose expansion of Coffin Butte Landfill. The Planning Commission spent untold hours researching, reading and hearing citizen testimony and, following their conclusions, <u>you</u> unanimously found that Republic Services had not met the burden of proof and <u>you</u> denied their application. Please just respect the time and effort that your own Planning Commission and citizens have put in and uphold your decision. It was the right one.

I do not live within the area <u>directly</u> affected by the odor, noise and recreation issues, but I am nonetheless concerned by any irreversible change to the character of my community. This expansion will seriously interfere with the character of the surrounding area in violation of Benton County Code 53.215 (1) and (2).

This expansion will also impose an undue burden on public resources far into the future, also violating Benton County code.

Code violations aside, I'm disappointed that by pursuing this expansion, **the County is ignoring its own** *2040 Thriving Communities Initiative*. I thought that our county leadership would try to truly represent our shared goals for responsible environmental stewardship, prioritizing public health, and sustainable waste management, as expressed in the 2040 Initiative.
