Dear Members of the Planning Commission,

At the request of Commissioner Biscoe, here are the data files I received to prepare my testimony.

Attached are:

1. A spreadsheet with data from the City of Corvallis water treatment facility via FOIA. Pay particular attention to the highlighted cells on the tab "SITES."
2. A spreadsheet containing data from Riverbend (McMinnville) and Clean Water Services (Hillsboro).
3. A spreadsheet with the NRSA Fish Tissue Study with EPA districts, including the data for OREGON. That data drives the indicators in the map.
4. A map of the United States showing concentrations of PFAS in Fish

The graph section noted above in the spreadsheets in attachment 3 underscore just one case.

Attachments 1 and 2 were sent to me by Joel Geier.

As I understand it, Mark Yeager used the FOIA process to get the data found in attachments 3 and 4. I received them from Joel Geier.

My comments regarding PFAS in Meibo eye drops came from an internet ad for Meibo, and I verified that the compound is a PFAS compound from Wikipedia.

In all fairness, information about PFAS is a far larger issue than just in landfills. It all flows from invention, manufacture, marketing, sales and use. The concern here is the disposal of waste and its safety thereafter.
