Our family has been enjoying recreational opportunities in the Dunn and McDonald forests for over 20 years. The NW winds bring hazardous air pollutants toward our hiking and MTB trails from the landfill, causing eye and headaches, especially when they are combined with smoke from our frequent wildfires during summer - the nearby small business owners will lose their customers in these already financially challenging times. My blueberries from the Anderson's Blues Blueberries, we pick up the berries ourselves. The expansion of the landfill further risking contamination of groundwater with Leachate. The hazardous air pollutants, methane and sulfides can be detected as early as

as of today, our Benton County's waste management sends for a large portion of all waste to be delivered to the neighboring counties. The proposed expansion only increase the unfair burden on Benton County taxpayers.

The community of a nearby ADAIR Village has already exposed to the methane emissions, breaking down organic compounds. The health sides, the entire community is apparently overlooked in the businesses' interests. The groundwater contamination is very likely to reach the nearby Willamette River, which is already polluted with agricultural fertilizers, mudslides, industrial pollutants, and development in the area close to McDonald's Dunn forests.
